We are very lucky to have such committed and flexible staff, who have coped admirably with the on/off nature of our activities during the pandemic. Our paid staff are also supported by a number of wonderful volunteers, whose contribution is invaluable. We always need more volunteers!

In future editions, I hope to be able to say a bit more about a few staff members and what they do, if I can twist their arms to overcome their modesty!


