Thoughts from Pete...

Perhaps, like me, you have been enjoying watching the Olympics. It is amazing to see what top sportspeople are able to achieve. Listening to Mark Foster and Becky Adlington talking about the best

swimmers, they mentioned the commitment and perseverance required. They also mentioned the need to always be learning, adapting and finding ways to improve.

Some of us, from the Free Church, were able to attend the ordination and induction of Joseph Amoah at St Paul's Church in Harrogate on 27th July. It was a joyous occasion. It was great to see Joseph again and to see the love and support which he enjoys from so many people.

The sermon included reference to Charles Wesley when he started his mission to proclaim God's love, back in the 1730s. His journal for May 1738 includes 'Sunday a.m., May 7, preached in St. Lawrence's, was asked not to come back anymore. Sunday p.m., May 7, preached at St. Katherine Cree's church, deacons said, "Get out and stay out." Sunday a.m., May 14, preached at St. Ann's, can't go back there either. Sunday afternoon, May 21, preached at St. John's, kicked out again. Sunday evening, May 21, preached at St. somebody else's, Bennet's maybe, deacons called special meeting and said I couldn't return. A year later his journal entry says 'Tuesday, May 8, afternoon service, preached in a pasture in Bath, 1,000 people came to hear me' and then 'Sunday, September 9, preached to 10,000 people three weeks in a row in Moorfields'.

This story is often quoted as an example of the need for perseverance when things aren't going to plan. What this account doesn't tell us is whether those early experiences helped Charles Wesley to become a better preacher. Was the turnaround just a matter of perseverance or was it also due to his willingness to learn, adapt and improve.

As churches, we are called to show commitment and perseverance along with that eagerness to learn, adapt and improve.

I'll finish with a thought that Joseph included in his talk -"When you trust God by praying and relying on him, when you don't see prayer as something separate to work but as the basis for your work, then God really does provide."
